## What is IDDC?

IDDC is an international not-for-profit association registered in Belgium. There are currently **23 member organisations**, including disability and development- and mainstream development organisations/networks and disabled people's organisations (DPOs).

## What is IDDC's aim?

IDDC's aim is to promote **inclusive development** internationally, with a particular focus on promoting full and effective enjoyment of human rights by all people with disabilities living in economically poor communities in lower and middle-income countries.

## Inclusive Development

**Inclusive development** means respecting the full human rights of every person, acknowledging diversity, eradicating poverty and ensuring that all people are fully included and can actively participate in development processes and activities, regardless of age, gender, disability, state of health, ethnic origin or any other characteristic.

## IDDC Objectives

1

To promote the inclusion of the disability dimension in all development policy and practice, as well as appropriate disability-specific approaches.

2

To improve the practice of member agencies through collaboration and sharing of experience on policy and practice.

3

To support exchange and learning about inclusive development through wide distribution of information, in particular between people and organisations in economically poorer countries.

## Membership

### IDDC members consist of

1. Full members: non-governmental organisations according to national law who are involved in and committed to inclusive development, and who are committed to a human-rights approach.
2. Associate members: organisations possessing legal personality, but not meeting all criteria for Full membership, or physical individuals who work in the field of inclusive development.

IDDC members meet annually at the **General Assembly** to share, learn and develop collaboration. IDDC Task Groups are working on:

- Community Based Rehabilitation**; development of policy and practice.
- Conflict and Emergencies**: research and advocacy to mainstream disability in humanitarian programmes.
- European Union**: advocacy to make the EU development policies and practices inclusive.
- HIV&AIDS**: advocacy for the appropriate inclusion of disability (issues) on the international HIV/AIDS agenda.
- Livelihood**: advocacy and exchange of good practices for better access to economic opportunities for disabled persons.
- Inclusive Education**; working to promote quality education for all through advocacy and sharing learning on good practice.
- Influencing the **United Nations**, its agencies and the Member States to make development policies and practices inclusive; collaborating with the UN Millennium Campaign to make the Millennium Development Goals inclusive to all: [www.IncludeEverybody.org](http://www.IncludeEverybody.org)
