What is IDDC?

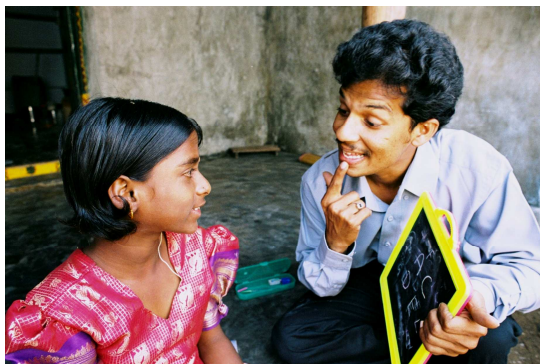
IDDC is an international non-governmental organisation registered in Belgium. There are currently **23 member organisations**, including disability and development- and mainstream development organisations and disabled people's organisations (DPOs).

What is IDDC's aim?

IDDC aims to promote **inclusive development** internationally, with a particular focus on promoting full and effective enjoyment of human rights by all people with disabilities living in economically poor communities in lower and middle-income countries.

Inclusive Development

Inclusive development means respecting the full human rights of every person, acknowledging diversity, eradicating poverty and ensuring that all people are fully included and can actively participate in development processes and activities, regardless of age, gender, disability, state of health, ethnic origin or any other characteristic.

IDDC Objectives

1

To promote the inclusion of the disability dimension in all development policy and practice, as well as appropriate disability-specific approaches.

2

To improve the practice of member agencies through collaboration and sharing of experience on policy and practice.

3

To support exchange and learning about inclusive development through wide distribution of information, in particular between people and organisations in economically poorer countries.

What does IDDC do?

At the **annual General Assembly** members share, learn and develop collaboration.

IDDC Task Groups are working on:

- Influencing the **European Union (EU)**: advocacy to make the EU development policies and practices inclusive.
- Influencing the **United Nations (UN)**, its agencies and the Member States to make development policies and practices inclusive; collaborating with the UN Millennium Campaign to make the Millennium Development Goals inclusive to all: www.IncludeEverybody.org
- **Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR)**: development of policy and practice.
- **HIV&AIDS and Disability**: advocacy for the appropriate inclusion of disability on the international HIV and AIDS agenda.
- **Inclusive Education**: promoting quality education for all through advocacy and sharing learning on good practice.
- **Livelihood**: advocacy and exchange of good practices for better access to economic opportunities for people with disabilities.

In addition, we have a Focal Point on **Conflict and Emergencies** so that IDDC members can keep each other informed on the issue.
