Importance of inclusive & accessible communication



UNCRPD - Art. 9 Accessibility

....States Parties shall take appropriate measures to ensure to persons with disabilities access, on an equal basis with others, to the physical environment, to transportation, to information and communications, including information and communications technologies and systems, and to other facilities and services open or provided to the public, both in urban and in rural areas.



Art 21. Freedom of expression and opinion, and access to information

States Parties shall take all appropriate measures to ensure that persons with disabilities can exercise the right to freedom of expression and opinion, including the freedom to seek, receive and impart information and ideas on an equal basis with others and through all forms of communication of their choice.



- a) Providing information intended for the general public to persons with disabilities in accessible formats and technologies appropriate to different kinds of disabilities in a timely manner and without additional cost;
- b) Accepting and facilitating the use of sign languages, Braille, augmentative and alternative communication, and all other accessible means, modes and formats of communication of their choice by persons with disabilities in official interactions;
- c) **Urging private entities** that provide services to the general public, including through the Internet, to provide information and services in accessible and usable formats for persons with disabilities;
- d) Encouraging the mass media, including providers of information through the Internet, to make their services accessible to persons with disabilities;
- e) Recognizing and promoting the use of sign languages.

(Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists, 2003).

Disability Friendly Language



Disability Friendly language

- Call people by their name
- Use people-first language
- Ask
- Avoid euphemistic terms
- People with/without disabilities
- Avoid acronyms



THE MOST APPROPRIATE LABEL IS USUALLY THE ONE PEOPLE'S PARENTS HAVE GIVEN THEM.



How do we portray people with disabilities in our communications?





Rightsbased communication

- With dignity
- As active participants
- Let people with disabilities speak for themselves
- Also portray people with disabilities when the topic is not disability related



How to overcome communication barriers?

- Use different formats to bring your message across
- Familiarise yourself with the accessibility needs of people with different kind of impairments
- Just ask, don't assume



Communication needs of People with visual impairments

- Access to text large print, braille, speech software, audio description
- Access to visual information of pictures & movies

Communication needs of people with hearing impairments

 Access to spoken language & sounds: Sign Language, closed captioning, subtitles

Possibility to express themselves








Communication needs of people with intellectual disabilities



Make a good document structure:

Use "Styles" for making a Title, Heading 1, Heading 2 etc.





Accessible Word Documents basic tips

Give each picture or diagram a description (alt text)





Accessible Word Documents basic tips

Use the Accessibility Checker to find accessibility issues in your document





Accessible Presentations

Same as above

- Good contrast of letters & background
- Be cautious with transferring PPTs to PDF files


